time for a change

Is it time to change the windows in your home? If you've draughty timber windows that need constant maintenance or old double glazed ones that are now past their best, replacing them with modern PVC-U is an economical way to transform your home.

Choosing PVC-U windows benefits the environment and can reduce your carbon footprint. PVC-U is a tough, durable product that will last for at least 35 years according to the British Research Establishment

They are virtually maintenance free so you avoid damaging the environment with repair products like solvents and paints. PVC-U windows are also fully recyclable; in 2007 42,162 tonnes of post consumer PVC-U was recycled in the UK. Old PVC-U windows are already used in the manufacture of new window products.

Because your new PVC-U windows will last for decades it's worth taking a little time to consider the options available to you. Our windows are custom made for you in a choice of traditional white or coloured 'real' wood finishes, a choice of glazing and various window styles - so whatever you decide it will add value to your home providing you with windows that retain their good looks year after year.

Things to consider when choosing new windows and doors:

Security

Modern doors and windows contain better security systems to ensure that they cannot be easily levered open and ensuring forced entry is more difficult. A modern door or window often employs multi-point locking systems. Whereas a traditional system may have one turn key lock, a multi-point system employs a number of dead bolt locks along the window or door strengthening the frame in different areas. Multi-point locks are often hook shaped so that they slot securely into the opposite frame making levering or forced entry more difficult.

Energy efficiency

Energy rated windows allow you to choose the most efficient window to suit your budget.

Styles

Traditional, contemporary or modern; our versatile window designs will create the look you want to compliment and enhance your home.

Finish

If you want windows that are as individual as you our Artisan range of coloured and woodgrain windows offer you twelve different colours and finishes.

10 top conservatory tips

What style will suit your home?

Is your home a period property or more contemporary, there will be a conservatory to suit every style.

Try to match your conservatory seamlessly to your home in terms of brickwork, colours and style.

Do you require planning permission?

In England and Wales planning permission is not usually required for a conservatory. If you are planning to buy a conservatory to expand your home you will be able to proceed without the need for planning permission so long as you do not exceed the development limit. But remember, if you live in a listed building or within a conservation area it is best to get council advice... better to be safe than sorry.

What is the best position for it to be installed?

Your installer will be able to advice you on this, so remember to think about where the sun will be in the daytime, will you require extra ventilation or blinds?

How big should it be?

Try not to take up too much of your garden space, your conservatory should be an extension of your home, but not at the expense of your lawn!

Have you considered an alternative to a white finish?

Personalise your conservatory to make it as individual as you are. From finials to cresting, lighting to heating and flooring to furniture, there are so many choices. Also with modern production techniques you are now able to choose coloured PVC-U which looks exactly like real woodgrain or with a paint effect. You can even decide to have your conservatory light oak on the inside to match your kitchen or wooden floor, but white or a beautiful painted effect on the outside!

Have you considered bi-fold doors?

Bi-fold doors can open up the whole elevation of your conservatory and bring the outside in! These versatile doors can even be used from your house into your conservatory, so making use of all the space available to you.

Plan your conservatory carefully beforehand

Mark out where in your garden the conservatory will be. Make sure you ask your installer for the internal dimensions of the finished conservatory will be.

A dwarf brick wall or a glass wall?

Do you want your conservatory to have a low wall, or have a full height glass wall to maximise the light

Will your conservatory be secure?

Remember to Lock up - for added security ensure you lock not just your external conservatory door, but also the door to the conservatory from your house.

Have you considered your neighbours?

Will your conservatory affect their enjoyment of their garden/sunlight.

made to measure

Your conservatory should be just that - yours. There are so many options available that one will be the perfect choice for you and your home.





The interior design of your conservatory is so important – you need to ensure your dreams and aspirations come true! Whatever style is right for you, there is the furniture, fabrics, lighting, heating and flooring to creative an atmosphere to dine, work or just relax in. New designs in furniture and trends in blinds, accessories and flooring has meant that a conservatory is not just an extension, but an extra room, a room from which you can enjoy light, space and your garden.

Furniture

It is important to consider what furniture to put in your conservatory. Your new room could be the first entry into your home from the garden, which means that you furniture could get covered in mud and grass stains, especially if you have children around! So the furniture you choose has to be up for a bit of wear and tear. Look for washable fabric cushions and removable covers, and the fabric you choose needs to be resistance to the damaging sunlight. Cane furniture is a popular choice as it is a natural material and is light enough to carry out into the garden on a lovely sunny day.

Flooring

Whether you choose wooden flooring or tiles, the options in terms of colour and style are endless. The floor will be easy to clean and with so many choices available you will certainly find one that suits your new room.

Blinds

A conservatory is an ideal way to bring light and space into your home, but you will need to consider some shade to control the heat and glare. Blinds are an ideal solution and come in different styles and some can simply be cut to fit. You can choose from roller, roman, woodweave, vertical or venetian blinds, all are available in different patterns and colours, and can be rolled up/opened to allow the maximum amount of light to flood your room. Blinds not only look good, but also have a practical purpose.

Heating

An ideal way to heat your conservatory is with slim line electric wall heaters – they are controllable and are small and discreet. You could even choose under floor heating. It is an efficient way to heat your room and once installed it is invisible and you are able to design your room without having to work around radiators.

Fans

Fans come in various sizes and with different speeds, forwards and backwards. Forwards to move the air around in the room and reverse to draw down the warm air which has risen and trapped in the roof – perfect for winter. Fans can be fitted with lights and can be operated with pull chains or by wall operated switches, or even remote control.

Air Conditioning

This is becoming more and more popular. A conservatory can be very hot in the summer and cold in the winter, but you want your room to be at a perfect temperature regardless of the season. Air conditioning is the ideal solution.

Glazing

You may wish to locate your conservatory near to your neighbour's fence, or by an open road, if so then you could choose a glazing option which will ensure that you're room is kept private. 
The British Fenestration Rating Council (BFRC) introduced the Window Energy Rating (WER) labelling scheme to assist consumers to make an informed decision regarding the energy performance of a window.

The energy ratings label is in a traffic light style and gives a rating based on the performance of the whole window (frame and glass) and therefore allows you to compare one window with another and make an informed choice. The A rating is the most efficient rating and G is the least energy efficient. Not only can it save an enormous amount of money on energy bills (which today seems to be the most expensive payout for many homeowners), but can also contribute to saving the environment.

So exactly what are energy efficient windows? They are windows that help to contain and conserve heat within the home keeping out wind and rain, resisting condensation and yet allowing natural 'free' energy - the warmth of the sun - to heat the home. They are easily recognised, just look for the traffic light label.

Every time you listen to the television or radio, or read a newspaper it is reported that energy prices are going to keep rising, so reducing your energy usage is more important than ever. Choose windows, doors and conservatories that not only save you money, but reduce your carbon footprint.

If you have single glazing in your home, or your double glazing was installed before 2002 you could literally be throwing money out of your windows! By replacing your windows and installing energy efficient windows with a minimum rating of a C and making small changes within your home you could save you hundreds of pounds a year, as well as reducing your carbon footprint.

Turn off lights




